

Open Data Open Opportunities

We are in the middle of a data revolution: new sources of data and new methods of data analysis are changing what we know about the world. This is a revolution that began in more advanced economies but offers many opportunities for developing economies. Recognizing this, the *High Level Panel on the Post-2015 Development Agenda* called for a "data revolution for sustainable development, with a new international initiative to improve the quality of statistics and information available to citizens."

What will it take? Increased investments in household and establishment surveys, complete civil registration and better administrative record systems, and innovative use of "big data" sources. Improved methods of data production, documentation, and preservation will increase the value of data. But the full value of data can only be realized when they are open -- free of charge, available to everyone in readily accessible formats, and licensed without limitation for use and reuse.

Today there is a widespread movement for open data. But uptake has been slow, especially in developing countries.

Increasing the value of development data through open data practices is the mission of Open Data Watch. Our goal is for all developing countries to realize the full potential of open data for their national statistical systems by improving the quality, timeliness, and usage of their statistics.

Open Data Watch is a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization founded by three development data specialists.
